Marshall Township's Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Program

In undisturbed landscapes, rainwater runoff is part of the natural hydrologic cycle. Vegetation, soils, and a wide range of organisms filter, absorb, and use rainfall in their living processes. Evaporation and transpiration takes place. Excess precipitation infiltrates into groundwater and flows into surface waters, recharging aquifers and supporting aquatic life. The entire system is affected when the landscape is changed: impervious surfaces (paved streets, parking lots, rooftops, etc.) prevent runoff from percolating into the ground and cause it to pick up debris, sediments, chemicals, and other pollutants as it moves over the ground.

Consider the path rainfall takes when it hits the ground: it soaks into the ground to become groundwater, evaporates, or flows over the surface of the land. This overland runoff—stormwater—feeds our surface waters, but it also carries sediments, chemicals, automobile oil, trash, and other natural and not so natural debris along with it. Groundcover, trees,


soil, wetlands, and a wide range of other landscape features act as buffers and barriers that slow stormwater, trap or filter out pollutants, and enable infiltration and evaporation to occur.

Unfortunately, the problems associated with stormwater aren't limited to major storms; they often result from the average rainfall event. Human activities dramatically alter the landscape and the natural system for stormwater management has difficulty working.

The federal Clean Water Act (CWA) prohibits the discharge of pollutants into waterways without the appropriate permits. Pennsylvania's Stormwater Management Act (better known as Act 167), MS4 Program, Chapter 102 (Erosion and Sediment Control Requirements), and NPDES Permit Program for Stormwater Discharges Associated with Construction Activities are amongst the Commonwealth's methods for meeting the runoff-related requirements of the Clean Water Act.

Implementation of stormwater management efforts in Pennsylvania occurs at the community level because individual municipalities are ultimately responsible for adopting zoning ordinances, subdivision and land development regulations, and other programs that keep their locality's runoff under control.

Marshall Township's MS4 Program was initiated in 2004 and has included mapping and inspecting stormwater infrastructure throughout the Township in an effort to detect illicit discharges. The Township has also adopted innovative stormwater management regulations to reduce and minimize the volume of stormwater generated from new land development. Marshall Township residents can also contribute to the improvement of water quality by reducing the amount of pollutants and stormwater generated from their property. Potential practices that a homeowner can employ include creating rain gardens, utilizing cisterns and rain barrels, and reducing lawn fertilization.




